Abstract	Must appear, not more than 100 words
Acknowledgments	Optional; may appear at end of paper – but before references
Affiliations	Name of the Company/Instituiton/Organisation.
Appendix	Optional, set after references as number 1 section head. More than 1 appendices should be lettered. (Appendix A, Appendix B)
Corresponding address	Write "Correspondence should be sent to" Include Department, affiliation, location, country – if other than US, and email address.
Figures (caption/citation)	Figures should be numbered and completely labeled. FIGURE 1 in all caps followed by a period. Then caption, initial caps – not ending in a period. (eg: FIGURE 1. Dimension Wise Reliability Coefficients)
Keywords	Must appear. Keywords spelled out in all caps followed by period, first word capitalized. (eg. KEYWORDS. Service quality, dimensions, attitude, competence, convenience)
Numbers	Use numerals throughout
Sequence of Authors	Follow given information
Table (citations/caption)	Tables should be numbered and completely labeled. TABLE 1 in all caps followed by a period. Then caption, initial caps – not ending in a period.
