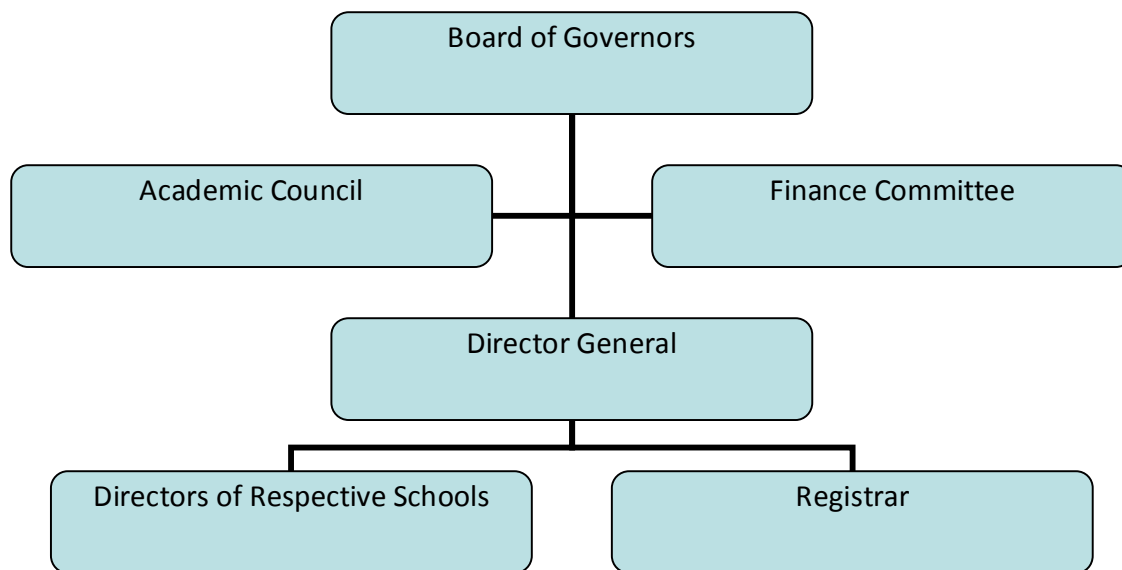

1. MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS (2):-

- (1) The value of each scholarship is the tuition fee prescribed from time to time.
- (2) In the order of merit first two students admitted will be eligible for these scholarships.
- (3) These scholars are not required to pay tuition fee at the time of accepting admission; however, they shall pay registration fee, deposits and other charges as prescribed.
- (4) These scholarships will be continued for the entire M.B.A. Programme of 2 years (6 Trimesters) subject to consistent good academic performance at each trimester examination, and exemplary discipline and conduct including punctuality.

2. SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIPS(2):-

- (1) The value of each scholarship is the tuition fee prescribed from time to time.
- (2) In the order of merit first two girls students admitted will be eligible for these scholarships.
- (3) If there is no student from Gujarat in (2) above, one additional scholarship namely Charotar Gas Scholarship for meritorious female student shall be offered to the girl student of Gujarat with highest merit among Gujarat students.
- (4) These scholars are not required to pay tuition fee at the time of accepting admission; however, they shall pay registration fee, deposits and other charges as prescribed.
- (5) These scholarships will be continued for the entire M.B.A. Programme of 2 years (6 Trimesters) subject to consistent good academic performance at each semester examination, and exemplary discipline and conduct including punctuality.

3. MERIT-CUM- MEANS SCHOLARSHIPS (2):-

- (1) The value of each scholarship is the tuition fee prescribed from time to time.
- (2) Students seeking such scholarships shall, at the time of accepting admission, apply for this in the prescribed form wherein authentic information about the family income and other relevant information shall be furnished.
- (3) A list of applicants shall be arranged in the ascending order of family income /dependents in the Family. Scholarship Committee, keeping in view relative merits, will decide award of scholarships to two applicants.

- (4) These students shall be refunded, as early as possible, the full amount of the tuition fee paid by them at the time of first admission. At each subsequent trimester they are exempted from paying the tuition fee; however, they shall pay registration Fee, deposits and other charges as prescribed.
- (5) These scholarships will be continued for the entire M.B.A, Programme of 2 years (6 Trimesters) subject to consistent good academic performance at each semester examination, and exemplary discipline and conduct including punctuality
- (6) If it is found at a later date that the Financial Information given by the awardees while seeking Merit-cum Means Scholarship was wrong, intentionally concealed or understated, his award could be cancelled and some penalty may be levied for giving wrong information.

4. FREESHIPS (2):-

- (1) One full freeship amounts to the tuition fee. Two full free ships/4 Half-freeships or combination thereof not exceeding 2 full free ships shall be awarded.
- (2) Students seeking Freeship shall apply, after admission, in the prescribed form wherein authentic information about the family income and other relevant information shall be furnished. Scholarship Committee shall interact with each applicant and then decide the award of freeships before the end of the first trimester.
- (3) Full or part of the tuition fee paid by the awardees of freeship shall be refunded in full or part as decided by the award given by the Scholarship Committee. At each subsequent trimester, the awardees shall pay zero or half tuition fee depending upon the freeship granted to them; however, they shall pay registration fee, deposits and other charges as prescribed.
- (4) These scholarships will be continued for the entire M.B.A. Programme of 2 years (6 Trimesters) subject to consistent good academic performance at each trimester examination, and exemplary discipline and conduct including punctuality.
- (5) If it is found at a later date that the Financial Information given by the Awardee while seeking Freeship was intentionally wrong, concealed or understated, his award could be cancelled and some penalty may be levied for giving wrong information.

Cancellation of Admission and Refund of fees:

If Admission Committee is convinced that a certain candidate has been wrongly admitted, the admission shall be cancelled with the approval of the Chairman, Admission Committee. In such an event the fees shall be refunded.

Refunds for withdrawal of admission will be as per the provisions of law (based on notification no. 14-4/2007 – U.3 (A) of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India).

If a candidate informs the School about his withdrawal of admission in writing on or before **23rd April, 2010**, after deducting a processing fee of Rs. 1,000 Rs. 1,04,000/- will be refunded.

If a candidate cancels the admission after **23rd April, 2010** the refund will be made after the completion of 1st term, provided the vacant position could be filled before the commencement of the Programme. The refund amount will be as per the clause 9.3. If the seat remains vacant due to any reason, no refund shall be made.

For withdrawal of admission and seeking refund, a candidate is required to submit the fee receipt, admission letter and the letter of request for withdrawal duly signed by him and counter signed by his parent/guardian.

IX. CRITERIA AND WEIGHTAGES FOR ADMISSION

Eligibility:

Candidates who have appeared at Common Admission Test (CAT) 2009 conducted by IIMs are eligible to apply.

The other eligibility criteria are listed in **SPM** Application Form as stated under:

“The minimum eligibility criterion for admission to MBA (Focused Oil & Gas Sector) is that the candidate must hold a Bachelor’s Degree, with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA, of any of the Universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a University under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956, an equivalent qualification recognized by the Ministry of HRD, Government of India. The Bachelor’s Degree or equivalent qualification obtained by the candidate must entail a minimum of three years of education after completing higher secondary schooling (10+2) or equivalent. The percentage obtained by the candidate in the bachelor’s degree would be calculated based on the practice followed by the university/ institution from where the candidate has obtained the degree. In case of the candidates being awarded grades/CGPA instead of marks, the equivalence would be based on the equivalence certified by the university/ institution from where they have obtained bachelor's degree. In case the university/ institution does not have any scheme for converting CGPA into equivalent marks, the equivalence would be established by the SPM by dividing obtained CGPA with the maximum possible CGPA and multiplying the quotient with 100.

Candidates appearing for the final bachelor's degree / equivalent qualification examination can also apply. Such candidates must produce a certificate from the authority of the of the university/ institution certifying that the candidate has obtained 50% marks or equivalent based on latest available grades/marks (i.e. all the years’ grade/marks except the final year grade/marks). Such candidates, if selected, will be allowed to join the programme provisionally only if they submit a certificate latest by **30th June, 2010** from a competent authority stating that they have completed all the requirements and have appeared for the examinations / practical etc. for the final year/final term whatever the case maybe (the results may, however, be awaited) for obtaining the bachelor's degree/ equivalent qualification on the date of issue of the certificate. However, their admission will be confirmed only when they submit the mark sheet and a certificate of having passed the bachelor's degree or its equivalent, with at least 50% marks. The last date for submission of the mark sheet and the certificate is **September 30th, 2010**. Non fulfilment of this condition will automatically result in the cancellation of the provisional admission.”

Group Discussion:

The group discussion is carried generally in a group of 10-12 students. Students appearing at GD are evaluated on the criteria of content of their participation, contribution in positive group dynamics and communication skills.

Personal Interview:

All shortlisted students are required to appear for the personal interview after group discussion. At this stage, potential of a candidate for the admission will be evaluated on the basis of his depth of knowledge, analytical skills, verbal communication, social awareness, international affairs awareness and motivation for Oil & Gas sector.

Profile of
Bhavesh Patel, Ph.D. - Director, School of Petroleum Management

Prof. Bhavesh Patel, a Fulbright Scholar from USA to Lebanon in 2008-09, has been currently the Director of School of Petroleum Management (SPM), Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University, Raisan (Gandhinagar), Gujarat.

Bhavesh Patel is in academia since last more than 33 years. In the initial academic career he taught at the Bachelor of Business Administration Program at B. J. Commerce College, Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Gujarat, before joining finance department of XLRI, Jamshedpur in 1985. After 15 years at XLRI, Jamshedpur he shifted to USA, where he worked for a brief period in industry for designing the financial reporting system and then taught at California State University, Stanislaus for a semester in 2001 before joining Chancellor (formerly Myers) University, Cleveland, Ohio. In USA, he was twice recognised as a best professor.

Bhavesh Patel has taught several courses in corporate finance, investment and management accounting at undergraduate as well as graduate programmes; in a traditional format and in online environment; and to young and adult students. He has designed an integrated business management game and some decision support systems in financial management for classroom teaching and executive training. He has a wide experience of business consulting and executive training in India and abroad.
